Nahum Tate's King Lear Nahum Tate's adaptation of King Lear debuted in 1681 In a dedicatory epistle to the published play, Tate says: "I found the whole [of Shakespeare's King Lear] ... a heap of jewels, unstrung and unpolished; yet so dazzling in their disorder, that I soon perceived I had seized a
