Songs and Sonettes, usually called Tottel's Miscellany, was the first printed anthology of English poetry First published by Richard Tottel in 1557 in London, it ran to many editions in the sixteenth century The First Folio is the first collected edition of William Shakespeare's plays, collated and published in 1623, seven years after his death
